Ad Council Reports

The Dec. 18 Administrative Council meeting concentrated on reviewing progress on various projects. Pastor Andrew introduced a Church Health Audit form that Council members each will

review and fill in based on their knowledge and experience. Topics for the audit include Vitals (attendance, membership), Giving and Finances (income, budget, giving, bank balances, debt), Preaching and Teaching (pastor's sermon schedule, teaching calendar), Volunteers (roster of volunteers, volunteer job descriptions, ministry teams), Communications (e-mails, social media, website), Leadership (goals, mission statements, meetings, team building), and Ministries (small groups, classes, outreach events). The information gathered for this audit will feed into the work we will do, starting in January, to develop our Covenant/Vision/Mission team and solicit support/volunteers for our 2017 election of officers and leaders.

Pastor Andrew asked for and was given the O.K. by the Council to clean, update and dispose of extraneous items as he sees fit. You have probably seen some changes for the better in the building already.
