Freedom Day – July 4th and the Christian Calendar

It is that time of year when we celebrate the creation of our country and the freedoms it

affords us. What fun to watch parades and fireworks, to decorate our homes with flags and buntings, to share BBQs with others, and to give thanks for this wonderful country where we can practice our faith, voice dissenting views, read what we want, go where we want, and be whoever we are. A blessing many of God's children do not enjoy.

While the creation of the United States is cause for celebration, what of the other creation: God's creation of the earth and the freedoms it brings? We do celebrate the birthday of the church, but what about creation itself? Is one day to celebrate creation not set aside because the creation took place over six days? Do we need a weeklong celebration – each day celebrating an aspect of creation? Or should we celebrate our creation every day? And what would that look like? How do we rejoice in and embrace the freedoms God provides for us?

Administrative Council Update

The Administrative Council meeting on May 21, 2017 included review of ongoing action items and discussion of the following issues: It was suggested to adjust the format of the monthly financial statement to include the year-to-date figures



compared to the year-to-date budget. Currently, the statement shows the total yearly budget. Painting the front doors was added to the trustee's to-do list. Joe Sanford's request was approved to arrange for Dr. Marv Nelson to bring his dental van to the church to supply free dental care for those in need. Several donations were received to help purchase an Automated External Defibrillator (AED). An AED is a device that delivers an electric shock to a person in cardiac arrest. Simplicity of operation is a key feature: controls are kept to a minimum, voice and visual prompts guide rescuers. Money from the Pastor's Discretionary Fund (AKA Dollar Club) will be used to purchase 55 shower cards so the homeless can shower at the Village Green Community Center. Updated and new photographs for the Redeemer Directory will be taken over the next few Sundays. Look for and thank Michael Stephenson who has graciously volunteered as our photographer.
