My Personal Mission

I would like to explain the background and thoughts that went into starting the RUMC

Caring and Sharing mission. We have always had directories at the church with everyone's name, address, phone number, and sometimes email contact information. If someone mentioned their or another's birthday or anniversary, you could send them a card or message, but it was hit or miss

I have had problems with depression for years. When my depression became severe and I had a mental health crisis a few years ago, I had a lot of time to thank God that I had survived. After a while I came back to church. At that time there was an environment and atmosphere of divisiveness and contention and, because of my fragile emotional status, I stayed away from church for 6-8 months. During that time only two people kept in contact with me. I started thinking of others and their life issues and wanted to make sure that their special life events were honored, that illness, accidents and surgeries were acknowledged with concern and prayers, that absences were noted and that people knew they were missed.

I mentioned my ideas to the pastor and said I would like to send cards and notes and make calls and visits. She thought that it was an excellent idea. I collected many birthdates and anniversary dates and began to send out personal cards. People at church started to come up to me and thank me for the cards, good wishes and prayers.

Prior to the All Church Conference, there will be a short Staff/Parish Relations Committee (SPRC) meeting. In addition to planning for this meeting, the trustees and Pastor Andrew will be working on a plan to replace or spruce up the outbuilding currently on our dumpster pad. Our annual fire inspection, sprinkler system check, and fire extinguisher checks will be completed in the next month. Also, we will be looking for a team to come up with a plan to upgrade our technology, including development of a funding plan.

Lynn's Musíngs -Tattoos

I see a lot of tattoos. It gets me wondering about why people get tattoos and what the story behind them is. Some tattoos are for personal decoration, like a flower or a heart or a skull. Still others mark an event, such as a coworker of mine who got a tattoo to mark his first business trip. Others are memorial tattoos. How close to the heart they must be. Our nephew is a police officer in San Diego, and he lost two men from his

unit and he has those officers' names tattooed on his body. I met another lady and asked her about the story of her tattoo – a cross with flowers and a woman's name. It turns out the tattoo was in memory of her grandmother who meant so much to her growing up and the tattoo is a visual reminder of shared love. While many people choose ink to tattoo, others have invisible tattoos etched on their hearts. Those tattoos are private, and for many, only God knows of them. What stories those tattoos could tell. Collectively, I think all the heart-etched tattoos tell the story of humanity and the human condition. What tattoo is on your heart? How does God engage you on its story?

This year Redeemer will have a Christmas Child Shoebox Packing Party on November 5th immediately following services, from about 1 p.m. to 3 p.m. These shoeboxes can be an amazing, transforming power in the world. After receiving a shoebox through the local church, the children are invited to enroll in a class entitled "The Greatest Journey," a 12-lesson discipleship program. So, each shoebox has the potential to change more than one life.

We are collecting items for the shoeboxes through October and boxes will also be available at the church soon, if you want to pack your own box. However, please remember to bring \$9 for each box you pack to subsidize the associated shipping costs. You can bring items you'd like to donate to the church and place them in the basket outside the office. The types of items needed include: deodorant, soap, brushes/combs, school supplies, small toys, hats, scarves, socks, toothbrushes, toothpaste, dolls, stationary, flashlights (ideally wind-up), stuffed animals, stickers, coloring books and crayons, travel games, jewelry, etc., BUT REMEMBER, all items need to fit in a shoebox!
